The band has received performance awards from *DownBeat* each year since 2002, and has been invited to perform at prestigious jazz festivals in both the U.S. and in Europe.

The night of March 12th will be a night to remember -- the musicians will entertain the audience with music from the “Big Band Era” accompanied by excellent vocalists on several of the performances.
